Applicants to the Doctoral Consortium should have begun their research, but should not have completed it in its entirety. You should briefly state which stage you currently are in your university's PhD program. Remember that we are seeking candidates who have an approved dissertation research topic and are carrying out their work, but who have enough work ahead of them that they can benefit from the exchanges and discussions that will take place at the Consortium.

Q1. What kind of academic program are you in?

Q2. How do you primarily identify yourself (e.g., computer scientist, ethnographer, social scientist, etc.)?

Q3. How many years have you been in that program, and how many years do you have left before graduating?

Q4. Have you completed your candidacy / research proposal stage (if required at your university)?

Q5. Please report below your brief biography (max 200 words).

Supervisor's Letter of Support

Attach to the paper a signed letter from your supervisor that supports your attendance at the Consortium. To ensure that this letter is helpful in the selection process, please pass on these requests to your supervisor:

To supervisors of Doctoral Consortium applicants: Your letter should not summarize your student's PhD project in detail or his/her past achievements – that is the job of the abstract and CV. Instead please provide the following information:

- How long you have supervised the student and in what capacity
- The status of this student with respect to your institution's PhD requirements
- When you expect the student to complete his/her dissertation
- Why attendance at this year's Doctoral Consortium would be particularly beneficial to the student
- What contributions the student is likely to make to the event if invited to attend
